Ms. Christoffersen stated that the Clerk of Court office has found many errors in their documents. Commissioner Toavs stated he has issues with this request; the wage increase started when Mr. Picos was County Attorney. The position should be on a regular pay schedule instead of a percentage. Second the position was advertised as a paralegal position and the paralegal position was not budgeted for. Ms. Christoffersen stated she was told by email from Commissioner Oelkers that the Commissioners are good with paying the position at eighty five percent. Commissioner Oelkers stated pay needs to be discussed and voted on in a commissioner meeting. Commissioner Macdonald stated that the County Attorney should be in the office if help is needed in the office. Ms. Christoffersen stated she would be in the office if the Commissioners did something about the harassment she is getting from other departments. Commissioner Oelkers stated he did send the email only for discussion, that it wasn't a decision. Mr. O'Connor expressed support for hiring Mrs. Fyfe as she did a good job but doesn't want to get in the middle of the rest of it.
