**RESOLUTION NO. 2023-65**

**A RESOLUTION CALLING FOR A PUBLIC HEARING TO HEAR PUBLIC INPUT ON ACCEPTING ROADS, AS DESCRIBED HERIN, TO BE A PUBLIC ROAD**

**WHEREAS**, the statutes of the State of Montana vest in the Board of County Commissioners with authority and responsibility regarding roads and bridges, and such statutes are generally found in Montana Code Annotated Title 7, Chapter 14, and;

**WHEREAS**, the Roosevelt County Commissioners are aware that the following roads exists in Roosevelt County known as **Road 2059, Road 1018, Road 1017, Road 1014, Road 2058, Road 1015, Road 2055, Road 2054, Road 1016, Road 2055, Road 2058, Road 1016, Road 1015, Road 2053, Road 1013, Road 2052, Road 2050, Road 2049, and Road 1012, which** are more specifically described as follows:

**Width of Right of Way is a strip of land 60 feet in width, lying 30 feet on each side of the centerline as currently constructed. If additional area is needed for grading and maintenance, it will be addressed on a per case basis.**

**Road 2059 – T28N R56E Section 25 and 36 AND T28N R57E Section 31 and 32**

BEGINNING AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROAD 2059 WITH Road 1015 AT THE QUARTER SECTION CORNER COMMON TO SECTIONS 32 and 33, TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 57 EAST, MPM; THENCE WEST ALONG THE EAST-WEST QUARTER LINE OF SAID SECTION 32 APPROXIMATELY 1,830 FEET; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY ALONG A CURVE APPROXIMATELY 900 FEET; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY APPROXIMATELY 1,780 FEET; THENCE WESTERLY ALONG A CURVE APPROXIMATELY 450 FEET; THENCE WESTERLY APPROXIMATELY 3100 FEET; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY APPROXIMATELY 1190 FEET; THENCE WESTERLY APPROXIMATELY 950 FEET; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY ALONG A CURVE APPROXIMATELY 380 FEET TO A POINT ON THE WEST LINE OF SAID TOWNSHIP; THENCE NORTHWEST APPROXIMATELY 1,130 FEET; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY ALONG A CURVE APPROXIMATELY 420 FEET; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY APPROXIMATELY 1800 FEET TO A POINT ON THE SECTION LINE COMMON TO SECTIONS 25 AND 36, TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 56 EAST, MPM; THENCE WEST ALONG SAID LINE APPROXIMATELY 600 FEET TO A POINT OF INTERSECTION WITH ROAD 1018, SAID POINT BEING APPROXIMATELY 1600 FEET EAST OF THE SECTION CORNER COMMON TO SECTIONS 25, 26, 35 AND 36.

THIS RIGHT OF WAY INCLUDES ADDITIIONAL WIDTH, AS NECESSARY, TO ACCOMMODATE Y JUNCTIONS AT THE INTERSECTIONS OF ROADS 2059 AND 1015 AND ROADS 2059 AND 1017.

**Road 1018 – T28N R56E Section 25 and 36**

BEGINNING AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROAD 1018 WITH ROAD 2059 AT A POINT ON THE SECTION LINE COMMON TO SECTIONS 25 AND 36, TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 56 EAST, MPM, SAID POINT BEING APPROXIMATELY 1600 FEET EAST OF THE SECTION CORNER COMMON TO SECTIONS 25, 26, 35 AND 36; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY ALONG A CURVE APPROXIMATELY 500 FEET TO A POINT ON THE WEST SIXTEENTH LINE OF SAID SECTION 25; THENCE NORTH ALONG SAID LINE APPROXIMATELY 4,900 FEET TO A POINT ON THE SECTION LINE COMMON TO SECTIONS 25 AND 24, SAID POINT BEING THE INTERSECTION WITH ROAD 2058.

THIS RIGHT OF WAY INCLUDES ADDITIIONAL WIDTH, AS NECESSARY, TO ACCOMMODATE A Y JUNCTION AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROADS 1018 AND 2058.

**Road 1017 – T27N R56E Section 1 AND T27N R57E Section 6 AND T28N R56E Section 36 AND T28N R57E Section 31**

BEGINNING AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROAD 1017 WITH ROAD 2059 AT A POINT ON THE RANGE LINE COMMON TO TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 56 EAST, MPM AND TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 57 EAST, MPM; THENCE SOUTH ALONG SAID RANGE LINE AND THE RANGE LINE COMMON TO TOWNSHIP 27 NORTH, RANGE 56 EAST, MPM AND TOWNSHIP 27 NORTH, RANGE 57 EAST, MPM APPROXIMATELY 1.28 MILES TO A POINT OF TERMINATION AT THE QUARTER CORNER COMMON TO SECTIONS 1 AND 6.

THIS RIGHT OF WAY INCLUDES ADDITIIONAL WIDTH, AS NECESSARY, TO ACCOMMODATE A Y JUNCTION AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROADS 1017 AND 2059.

**Road 1014 – T28N R57E Section 28 and 33**

BEGINNING AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROAD 1014 WITH HWY 2 AT A POINT IN THE NORTHEAST QUARTER OF SECTION 33, TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 57 EAST, MPM, SAID POINT BEING ON THE EAST SIXTEENTH LINE OF SAID SECTION; THENCE NORTH ALONG SAID LINE AND THE EAST SIXTEENTH LINE OF SECTION 28 APPROXIMATELY 2,390 FEET; THENCE NORTH-NORTHWESTERLY APPROXIMATELY 870 FEET; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY APPROXIMATELY 360 FEET; THENCE NORTH APPROXIMATELY 240 FEET; THENCE NORTH-NORTHWESTERLY APPROXIMATELY 520 FEET; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY APPROXIMATELY 1560 FEET; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY ALONG A CURVE APPROXIMATELY 200 FEET TO A POINT ON THE SECTION LINE COMMON TO SECTIONS 21 AND 28, SAID POINT BEING THE INTERSECTION WITH ROAD 2058.

**Road 1015 – T28N R57E Section 4, 5, 8, 9, 16, 17, 20, and 21**

BEGINNING AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROAD 1015 WITH ROAD 2058 AT A POINT ON THE SECTION LINE COMMON TO SECTIONS 21 AND 28, TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 57 EAST, MPM, SAID POINT BEING APPROXIMATELY 270 FEET EAST OF THE SECTION CORNER COMMON TO SECTIONS 20, 21, 28 AND 29; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY ALONG A CURVE APPROXIMATELY 400 FEET TO A POINT ON THE SECTION LINE COMMON TO SECTIONS 20 AND 21; THENCE NORTH ALONG SAID SECTION LINE AND THE SECTION LINES COMMON TO SECTIONS 16 AND 17, SECTIONS 8 AND 9 AND SECTIONS 4 AND 5 APPROXIMATELY 4.0 MILES TO A POINT ON THE NORTH LINE OF SAID TOWNSHIP, SAID POINT BEING THE INTERSECTION WITH ROAD 2054.

THIS RIGHT OF WAY INCLUDES ADDITIIONAL WIDTH, AS NECESSARY, TO ACCOMMODATE A Y JUNCTION AT THE INTERSECTIONS OF ROADS 1015 AND 2054.

**Road 2055 – T28N R57E Section 3, 4, 9, and 10**

BEGINNING AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROAD 2055 WITH ROAD 1015 AT THE SECTION CORNER COMMON TO SECTIONS 4, 5, 8 AND 9, TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 57 EAST, MPM; THENCE EAST ALONG THE SECTION LINE COMMON TO SECTIONS 4 AND 9 AND SECTIONS 3 AND 10 APPROXIMATELY 2.0 MILES TO THE SECTION CORNER COMMON TO SECTIONS 2, 3, 10 AND 11.

THIS RIGHT OF WAY INCLUDES ADDITIIONAL WIDTH, AS NECESSARY, TO ACCOMMODATE A Y JUNCTION AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROADS 2055 AND 1015.

**Road 2054 – T28N R56E Section 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 AND T28N R57E Section 4, 5, and 6 AND T29N R55E Section 35 and 36 AND T29N R56E Section 31, 32, 33 34, 35, and 36 AND T29N R57E Section 31**

BEGINNING AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROAD 2054 WITH ROAD 1023 AT A POINT ON THE SECTION LINE COMMON TO SECTIONS 34 AND 35, TOWNSHIP 29 NORTH, RANGE 55 EAST, MPM, SAID POINT BEING APPROXIMATELY 320 FEET NORTH OF THE SOUTH SECTION CORNER COMMON TO BOTH SECTIONS; THENCE SOUTHEASTERLY ALONG A CURVE APPROXIMATELY 550 FEET TO A POINT ON THE TOWNSHIP LINE COMMON TO SAID TOWNSHIP AND TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 56 EAST, MPM; THENCE EAST ALONG SAID TOWNSHIP LINE APPROXIMATELY 8.25 MILES TO A POINT OF TERMINATION ON THE TOWNSHIP LINE COMMON TO TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 57 EAST, MPM AND TOWNSHIP 29 NORTH, RANGE 57 EAST, MPM, SAID POINT BEING APPROXIMATELY 1660 FEET EAST OF THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SAID TOWNSHIP 29 NORTH, RANGE 57 EAST.

THIS RIGHT OF WAY INCLUDES ADDITIIONAL WIDTH, AS NECESSARY, TO ACCOMMODATE Y JUNCTIONS AT THE INTERSECTIONS OF ROADS 1016 AND 2055 AND ROADS 1016 AND 2054.

**Road 2055– T28N R56E Section 1, 2, 11, and 12 AND T28N R57E Section 6 and 7**

BEGINNING AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROAD 2055 WITH ROAD 1016 AT THE SECTION CORNER COMMON TO SECTIONS 5, 6, 7, AND 8, TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 57 EAST, MPM; THENCE WEST ALONG THE SECTION LINE COMMON TO SAID SECTIONS 6 AND 7 APPROXIMATELY 4,820 FEET; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY APPROXIMATELY 350 FEET TO A POINT ON THE SECTION LINE COMMON TO SECTIONS 1 AND 12, TOWNSHIP 28 NORTH, RANGE 56 EAST, MPM; THENCE WEST ALONG SAID LINE AND THE SECTION LINE COMMON TO SECTIONS 2 AND 11 APPROXIMATELY

1.45 MILES; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY ALONG A CURVE APPROXIMATELY 280 FEET; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY ALONG A CURVE APPROXIMATELY 380 FEET; THENCE NORTHWEST APPROXIMATELY 800 FEET; THENCE NORTHERLY ALONG A CURVE APPROXIMATELY 360 FEET; THENCE NORTH APPROXIMATELY 350 FEET; THENCE NORTHWESTERLY ALONG A CURVE APPROXIMATELY 500 FEET TO A Y INTERSECTION WITH ROAD 1019; SAID POINT BEING APPROXIMATELY 300 FEET WEST OF THE SOUTHWEST SIXTEENTH LINE.

**Road 1015 - T29N R56E Section 1, 12, 13, 24, 25, and 36 AND T29N R57E Section 6, 7, 18, 19, 30, and 31**

BEGINNING AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROAD 1015 WITH ROAD 2054 AT THE SOUTHERNLY TOWNSHIP CORNER COMMON TO TOWNSHIP 29 NORTH, RANGE 56 EAST, MPM AND TOWNSHIP 29 NORTH, RANGE 57 EAST, MPM; THENCE NORTH ALONG THE RANGE LINE COMMON TO SAID TOWNSHIPS APPROXIMATELY 6.0 MILES TO THE NORTHERLY TOWNSHIP CORNER COMMON TO SAID TOWNSHIPS, SAID CORNER BEING THE INTERSECTION WITH ROAD 2048.

THIS RIGHT OF WAY INCLUDES ADDITIIONAL WIDTH, AS NECESSARY, TO ACCOMMODATE A Y JUNCTION AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROADS 1015 AND 2054 AND ROADS 1015 AND 2049.

**Road 2052 – T29N R54E Section 22, 23, 24, and 25 AND T29N R55E Section 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, and 30 AND T29N R56E Section 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, and 30 AND T29N R57E Section 19, 20, 21, 28, 29, and 30**

BEGINNING AT THE INTERSECTION OF ROAD 2052 WITH ROAD 1013 AT A POINT ON THE SECTION LINE COMMON TO SECTIONS 21 AND 28, TOWNSHIP 29 NORTH, RANGE 57 EAST, MPM, SAID POINT BEING APPROXIMATELY 1020 FEET EAST OF THE SECTION CORNER COMMON TO SECTIONS 20, 21, 28 AND 29; THENCE WEST ALONG SAID SECTION LINE AND THE SECTION LINE COMMON TO SECTIONS 20 AND 29 APPROXIMATELY 2.19 MILES TO A POINT ON THE WEST RANGE LINE OF SAID TOWNSHIP; THENCE CONTINUING WEST ALONG THE SECTION LINE COMMON TO SECTIONS 24 AND 25, TOWNSHIP 29 NORTH, RANGE 56 EAST, MPM APPROXIMATELY 1,640 FEET TO THE INTERSECTION WITH FIRST AVENUE AND PARK STREET IN THE TOWN OF MCCABE.
