A RESOLUTION CALLING FOR A PUBLIC HEARING TO HEAR PUBLIC INPUT ON ACCEPTING ROADS, AS DESCRIBED HERIN, TO BE A PUBLIC ROAD

WHEREAS, the statues of the State of Montana vest in the Board of County Commissioners with authority and responsibility regarding roads and bridges, and such statutes are generally found in Montana Code Annotated Title 7, Chapter 14, and;

WHEREAS, the Roosevelt County Commissioners are aware that the following roads exists in Roosevelt County known as Road 1000, Road 1000, Road 2043, Road 2044, Road 2045, Road 1002, Road 1001, Road 2049, Road 2049, Road 1004, Road 1006, HWY 405 N, Road 2057, Road 1005, Road 1004, Road 2054, Road 1003, Road 1000, which are more specifically described as follows:

Width of Right of Way is a strip of land 60 feet in width, lying 30 feet on each side of the centerline as currently constructed. If additional area is needed for grading and maintenance, it will be addressed on a per case basis.

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING AUTHORITY FOR DISTRIBUTION OF COUNTY MINIMUM ALLOCATION GRANTS FOR WATER AND SEWER INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS Resolution

WHEREAS, Section 4 of Chapter 401 of the Montana Session Laws of 2021 through House Bill 632 Section 4 allocated the amount of \$150 million of the coronavirus state fiscal recovery funds to be used to provide minimum allocation grants for water and sewer infrastructure projects eligible for funding under the American Rescue Plan;
