**RESOLUTION NO. 2026-4**

**A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE FINAL OPERATING BUDGET AND SETTING APPROPRIATION AUTHORITY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2025 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2026**

**WHEREAS**, Section 7-6-4030, MCA, provides that the governing body shall adopt the final budget by resolution. The resolution must:

- (a) Authorize appropriations to defray the expenses or liabilities for the fiscal year;
- (b) Establish legal spending limits at the level of detail in the resolution; and
- (c) Include any increase in property taxes, including an increase authorized under 15-10-420(1) and the amount by which property taxes will increase on homes valued at \$100,000, \$300,000 and \$600,000.

**WHEREAS**, Section 7-6-4020 requires that a preliminary annual operating budget must be prepared for the local government; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 7-6-4021 requires that the governing body shall cause a notice of public hearing on the preliminary or amended budget to be published, and

**WHEREAS**, Section 7-6-4024, provides that the governing body must hold a public hearing in accordance with the notice given pursuant to 7-6-4021; and

**WHEREAS**, The Board of County Commissioners held a public hearing on September 3, 2025 where residents of the County were allowed to express their concerns about the proposed budget; and

**WHEREAS**, The Board of County Commissioners has reviewed the proposed budget, received the estimated ending cash balances for all county funds, made changes to the budget as deemed necessary following the public hearing(s) and from input by elected officials and department heads, and computed the estimated taxes, fees and assessments needed to fund the fiscal year 2026 budget.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of County Commissioners of Roosevelt County that:

The final budget after any amendments to the preliminary budget and after considering any public comment is adopted.

This resolution authorizes:

- (a) Appropriations to defray the expenses or liabilities for the fiscal year.
- (b) It sets the legal spending limits at the county fund level. Fund level details are stated in the formal budget document and established in the County's accounting system.
- (c) An increase in county wide property taxes due to (15-10-420 calculation), permissive levy and jail bond levy, of \$7.39, \$22.16, and \$44.30, respectively for a home valued at \$100,000, \$300,000, and \$600,000 is included in this fiscal year budget.

(d) An increase in the rural county road property taxes due to (15-10-420 calculation) of \$2.31, \$6.93, and \$13.85, respectively for a home valued at \$100,000, 300,000, and \$600,000 is included in this fiscal year budget.

The effective date of this resolution is July 1, 2025, even if the resolution is adopted after that date.

**Action on Resolution 2026-5, Establishing the Method of Levying Voted Mills**

**RESOLUTION NO. 2026-5**

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE METHOD OF LEVYING VOTED MILLS PER HB231 AND SB542 PASSED IN THE 2025 MONTANA LEGISLATURE

**WHEREAS**, the Board of County Commissioners of Roosevelt County, Montana, has determined that voter approved mill levies are required to be recalculated under two new bills passed by the 2025 Legislature; and

**WHEREAS**, the new legislation requires that voted mills use one of two methods to recalculate the mill levy. The first method starts with the FY2025 assessed tax revenue for the voted levy and applies the formula in MCA 15-10-420 for FY2026 and all future years of the levy. The second method uses the FY2025 assessed tax revenue and calculates the number of mills required to levy that amount of revenue using the FY2026 taxable value. That number of mills is the maximum number of mills to be levied for FY2026 and all future years; and

**WHEREAS**, Roosevelt County has the following voter approved mill levies: 2110 Road Fund (8 Mills), 2300- Public Safety Fund (7 Mills), 7370- Hospital 1 & 9 Ambulance Fund (3 Mills), 7371 Poplar Hospital District (3 Mills), 7372- Culbertson Hospital District( 3 Mills), 7373 Culbertson Hospital District Emergency Medical Services (9 Mills), 7374- Hospital District 3 & 45 (3 Mills), 7375- Hospital 3 & 45 Ambulance (3 Mills); and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by this Board of County Commissioners that the 2110 Road Fund (8 Mills), 2300 Public Safety Fund (7 Mills), 7370 Hospital 1 & 9 Ambulance Fund (3 Mills), 7371 Poplar Hospital District (3 Mills), 7372 Culbertson Hospital District( 3 Mills), 7373 Culbertson Hospital District Emergency Medical Services (9 Mills), 7374 Hospital District 3 & 45 (3 Mills), 7375 Hospital 3 & 45 Ambulance (3 Mills), mill levies will be recalculated using FY2025 assessed tax revenue for the voted levy and applies the formula in MCA 15-10-420 for FY2026 and all future years of the levy.
